WILDCARE Inc. was established in 1997 as a community volunteer organisation to support reserve management, nature conservation and cultural heritage conservation in Tasmania. Membership has grown rapidly to around 3000 members today, with members creating 50 friends groups for specific reserves or conservation objectives. Volunteering

Members provide hundreds of thousands of hours of volunteer work each year, worth many millions of dollars, working alongside staff from the Parks and Wildlife Service, Biodiversity Conservation Branch and Wildlife Management Branch of DPIPW, local council staff as well as other like-minded organisations.

Philanthropy

WILDCARE Inc. was registered as an environmental organisation in 2005 and created a public fund, called the WILDCARE Gift Fund, to accept public donations for nature conservation and reserve management in Tasmania. WILDCARE Inc. and its public fund were registered as a deductible gift recipient, also in 2005. This means that all donations of more than \$2 are tax-deductible, including corporate donations.

WILDCARE is also an approved charity with the Tasmanian State Service Workplace Giving Scheme, and is the preferred gift fund for the Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service.

The Parks and Wildlife Service has recognised the WILDCARE Gift Fund as its preferred gift fund and encourages donors, large and small, who wish to support nature conservation and reserve management in Tasmania to donate to the WILDCARE Gift Fund.
